



Fighting Rightwing Populism is an international project that involves CRISP, a German NGO, as coordinator, and partners from Greece (ANTIGONE), Cyprus, FYROM, Germany, Italy, Ukraine. The main goal of the project is to develop and conduct a simulation game that tackles the sources, reasons, and effects of rightwing populism in Europe. At the end of the project a simulation game will be available for other trainers of non-formal education, as well as for teachers at schools and lecturers at universities.

The project is divided in four activities. As a first step 14 trainers from the 7 partner organizations will come together for a one week seminar. After being introduced to the method of simulation gaming, they will develop one game tackling the topic of rightwing populism. During the second and the third activity the new developed simulation game will be tested and improved in Berlin and in Thessaloniki with a wider circle of persons involved in youth work. The last activity will be held in Bruxelles. Here the results of the previous meetings will be presented. The simulation game will be adjusted according to the suggestions developed during the implementation phase. Furthermore, the outcomes of the simulation game will be shared and discussed with European politicians through a panel discussion.
